84th Railsplitter Association End of Life Guidance

Hardly a month goes by that we don't learn of the passing of one of our 84th Division colleagues. Like several of our association members, over many years I have received calls from concerned survivors of our veterans seeking advice on what to do next. All too often I have learned that too many veterans had done little or no planning for their deaths and their spouses/families were left with the burden of a funeral with no idea where to start. I am concerned that so many of us have not been prepared for our eventual deaths. Incredibly, I recall one of these troops had been divorced and remarried, but never put his second wife in the DEERS (records) system - so the benefits went to the ex-wife.

Our board of directors realizes we are not able to offer legal advice, so we strongly encourage you to do so before your survivors have to face the double tragedy of your death, and no plan for them to follow to respond. To address this concern, we are developing a guide to follow. The guide is too lengthy to include in the newsletter so it will be posted on the website on or about May 1. The guide is intended to assist you in your end-of-life planning. It is based on input from several senior members of the Association who are knowledgeable in these matters. I strongly encourage you to update the plan annually as some of these offices and references will certainly change. Once again, you are encouraged to secure legal advice in this process. It would be tragic if your last decision at the end of your life was to place your loved in a terrible dilemma.
