BG COCROFT HONORED

On Thursday, July 21, 2022, I attended a special ceremony held to honor 84th Division alumnus Brigadier General Robert A. Cocroft. Bob Cocroft had been the Director of the Center for Veterans Issues (CVI) for fourteen years when he unexpectedly died on September 12, 2018, at the age of 71. The purpose of the ceremony was multi-fold. First, to officially name the new CVI Resource Center after Bob. A crowd of over of 100 people, to include Bob's wife Jacqui, and their family, were in attendance. Next, Bob was also recognized for his co-founding of the National Association of Black Veterans in the 1970s, which now boasts over 150 offices nation-wide.

Additionally, it was announced that the General had been inducted into the Officer Candidate School (OCS) Hall-of-Fame. As a 1970 graduate of OCS at Ft. Benning, Georgia, and having successfully completed battalion and brigade command, BG Cocroft

was clearly eligible. His classmate, retired LTC Emory Deason, appeared in person to make the presentation.

Finally, the new "Brigadier General Robert A. Cocroft Veterans Resource Center" is located at 3400 West Wisconsin Avenue in Milwaukee. On July 20, the Milwaukee Common Council voted to rename the parts of Wisconsin Avenue near the Center after Brigadier General Robert A. Cocroft.

Personally, I was fortunate to have served with Bob in the 84th Division and later when we served together on the Board of Directors of the Milwaukee County War Memorial. I will remember him as a good man, a good soldier, and a great humanitarian. He will be missed by many.

Change in Temporary Guidance for USID Cards

All Uniformed Services ID (USID) Cards issued to retirees and their dependents, that were previously extended in accordance with Department of Defense (DoD) temporary guidance for USID cards during the COVID-19 pandemic, **expired January 31, 2022, and must be replaced**. Please schedule an appointment at your earliest opportunity. Although the benefits to which the cardholder is entitled, in most cases, remain in effect, installations may deny access to retirees and dependents with an expired USID card.

To schedule an appointment to have an ID card reissued, visit the ID Card Office Online website (https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/), and select the ID Card Office Locator & Appointments option.

Exercise Summer at the 84th Training Command

<u>FORT KNOX</u>, <u>Ky</u>. – The Summer marks the beginning the commands exercise season that is hosted by the 84th Training Command and its subordinate divisions.

The vision of the 84th TC commanding general, Maj. Gen. Mike Castellanos, is to provide total force and multinational collective training in a Mission Command-focused setting to build and sustain trained and equipped units ready to perform in the dynamic operational environment.

Some of the recurring exercises and capstone events are meticulously designed to validate realistic combat support collective training, leader development, and mission command to prepare Soldiers and units for future operational challenges while prioritizing the quality of life of Soldiers, Civilians and Families.

Currently, there are seven ongoing exercises hosted by the training divisions.

Operation Hood Strike, hosted by the 87th Training Division's 1st Brigade Mission Training Complex at Fort Hood, Tx., just concluded. The 980th Engineer Battalion of the 420th Engineer Brigade, composed of six companies spanning across Texas, Arkansas, and Oklahoma, joined together for one mission: to improve their combat skill proficiency at the individual, squad and platoon levels.

Operation Hood Strike allows Soldiers to execute Mission Essential Tasks or MET's that are necessary for them to enhance pre-deployment, planning, and preparation activities that increase their readiness posture.

Meanwhile, Operation Postal Warrior, located at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, is underway and hosted by the 78th Training Division.

Postal Warrior is a standalone 15-day, task-focused exercise, designed to train and challenge postal units in the skill sets and competencies needed to support Theater Postal Operations and increase individual and collective readiness.

The capstone exercises are always the division War Exercises or WAREX. Currently, the 78th Training Division is executing the initial stages of its WAREX at Fort Mccoy, WI. Rotational units have conducted initial readiness exercises and Soldiers were given primary marksmanship instruction (PMI) courses on their individual weapon systems and preliminary table certifications in preparation for their table IV qualifications in the following days.

Army Combat Fitness Tests were conducted evaluating individual Soldier fitness conditions that enhance RTU readiness and mission capability for future rapid deployment.


WAREX's are annual training events integrating both combat support and combat service support assets to train United States Army Reserve Soldiers. The exercise facilitates opportunities to proactively handle real-world scenarios with competency in infantry tactics, defensive posture, vertical and horizontal construction, convoy operations and maintenance, communication planning and security, and media operations.

The 78th TD and 87th TD will host one more WAREX each in August.

The 84th is also establishing its first Railsplitter Association Chapter out of Fort Knox. Currently, the draft By-Laws are under review with the unit Staff Judge Advocate office to ensure legitimate legal protections and validation of governing agency.

Once approved, a panel of directors will be chosen as the program is established and an agenda is set.

The mission of this organization is to promote fellowship among members (past, present and future) of the former 84th Division, 84th Training Command, and their predecessor/successor commands, support charitable organizations which benefit current or former members of the United States military, and to hold in patriotic reverence the memory and spirit of those who served in the 84th Division, 84th Training Command, and their predecessor/successor commands.










Fort Knox Mission Training Complex Radio Wire Integration System (RWIS) to interface with Tactical Communication

What:	Utilize RWIS to interface with Tactical Communication	
When:	8-24 July 2022	
Where:	Fort Knox, Kentucky	
Why:	RWIS allows exercise participating units to replicate organic radio communication systems to a simulated radio environment over Tactical Exercise Networks utilizing a Voisus server. RWIS is an economical solution for connecting live and simulated training environments and distributing live, over-the-air voice traffic via worldwide data networks. This breakthrough creates a more realistic tactical training environment. Fort Knox MTC will be the first USARC MTC to incorporate the RWIS with tactical communication, Single Channel Ground and Airborne Radio System (SINCGARS). Fort Knox MTC has configured and programmed 10-RWIS for connection to 2-SINCGARS to allow communication between the 375th CSSB Tactical Operations Center (TOC) and their subordinating units during their upcoming CPX-F, 8-24 July 2022. Fort Knox MTC RWIS Voisus server will serve as the base station for communication when the 375th CSSB communicate tactically using SINCGARS and RWIS to their subordinate units during convoy operations from cantonment area to field training areas. The end user for RWIS will interface as if is a live SINCGARS during communication.
